The mission of the Foundation is to help achieve the sustainable development goals of the United Nations by providing innovation and collaboration to create initiatives centered around clean water, sustainable greenspaces, and promoting carbon neutrality through a variety of innovative practices and education opportunities.

The Foundation will further its exempt purpose by operating the following programs: (1) Clean Water and Sanitation Program.

Billions of people lack access to safe drinking water, sanitation, and hygiene. According to the United Nations, in 2020 2 billion people lacked safety- managed drinking water, 3.6 billion people lacked safety-managed sanitation, and 2.3 billion people lacked basic hygiene.

The Foundation will help ensure the availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation to communities in need. The Foundation initially is going to purchase water filtration systems, both handheld and community wide systems, to facilitate the delivery, installation, and distribution of these water filtration systems to communities that are in need of clean water and sustainably-managed water resources.

The Foundation will select the communities to support by developing alliances with other charity organizations and governments. The Foundation will select the communities most in need and will be located in North, Central and South America and in other parts of the world in which the Foundation can safely travel. It is expected that many of the communities will be small and rural. Special consideration will be placed on communities in which the Foundation can engage and partner with, such as local colleges and/or other education institutes, which can help educate the community on proper water management.

The Foundation itself is going to perform and operate this program. The Foundation is not going to make grants, loans, or other distributions to other organizations to ensure all funds will be used to further the Foundation's exempt purpose. It is expected that 50% of the Foundation's time and expenses will be dedicated to this program.

(2) Sustainable Greenspace Program.

Deforestation and desertification, caused by human activity and climate change, pose major challenges to sustainable development and have affected the lives and livelihoods of millions of people. Forests are vitally important for sustaining life and play a major role in the fight against climate change.

This program realizes the protection and restoration of forest and green space. The Foundation will purchase crop land and/or forests in order to capture as much carbon as possible in the soils, timber, and organic matter and protect the greenspace from misuse. Initially, the real estate purchased will be located within the United States. However, the Foundation might in the future purchase real estate in other parts of the world.

In determining which real estate to purchase, the Foundation will test the real estate to see how much carbon the real estate can capture. The Foundations goal is to purchase the real estate that can capture the most carbon for the lowest price.

The real estate purchased will produce carbon credits that may be sold on the open market. The Foundation will sell the carbon credits on the open market in order to help fund its operations.

The Foundation itself is going to perform and operate this program. The Foundation is not going to make grants, loans, or other distributions to other organizations to ensure all funds will be used to further the Foundation's exempt purpose. It is expected that 50% of the Foundation's time and expenses will be dedicated to this program.

The Foundation will operate as a private operating foundation. The Foundation will initially be funded by the Trustees of the Foundation. The Foundation will also accept donations from the public. Once the Foundation has implemented and achieved some of its goals, it might conduct outside fundraising efforts.
